demands quality (her flowers are flown in twice per week from Holland). Dixon also adds unexpected details, such as Swarovski crystals or flirtatious feathers, to her bouquets; or, if tradition demands a lei (as is the custom in Polynesian weddings) in addition to or in lieu of a bouquet, Dixon and the Wedding Salons staff easily can fulfill this request.

Whether you reserve a private reception room or dine in one of Wynn's world-class restaurants, the post-wedding feast likewise will live up to a bride and groom's fantasies. Unlike any catering venue in Las Vegas, Wynn boasts two of the world's top chefs working in its kitchens: executive chef for catering and special events Marc Poidevin, (formerly of Le Cirque), and chef de cuisine James Benson (formerly of Circo). The exquisite cuisine is complemented by equally impressive dinnerware, thanks to director of catering

Montoya offers some valuable advice for couples choosing a wedding venue: "Preview other venues before making a decision," she says. "Educate yourselves and consider all of your options. Most importantly, ensure that the wedding consultant with whom you have your initial meeting is the wedding consultant who will be your direct contact throughout your planning process. After all, the details of your wedding are too precious to leave for just anyone to handle." ♦
